This picture shows a crowd of people in the "scramble" crossing in Shibuya, one of the busiest crossings in Tokyo. The building in the center is SHIBUYA TSUTAYA book store. A "scramble" crossing means a crossing where vehicles from all four directions are stopped and allows pedestrians to cross in every direction. It is so named because it has some analogy to scrambled eggs.

\*pedestrian(s)= someone walking in the street and not traveling in a vehicle
\*vehicle= something that is used for transporting people or goods from one place to another

- Q1: Describe what's called "Scramble Crossing " in English.
  - → It is <u>a crossing where vehicles from all directions are stopped at a time for</u> <u>pedestrians.</u>
- Q2: Do you think this kind of crossing is convenient or dangerous? Why?
