世界的な活躍で知られる指揮者の小澤征爾氏は、みなさんと同年代のころに、ある転機を迎えたようです。どのような転機なのか、読んでみましょう。

❁ Seiji Ozawa was born in 1935. He first became interested in the piano at the age of ten. When he entered junior high school, he became very serious about playing the piano. He started taking lessons from a professional piano teacher. Ozawa also started to play rugby* around that time. However, his mother asked him not to play that sport because 5 fingers are very important for a pianist. Still, he continued to play rugby secretly. And then, just before he became a third-year student in junior high school, he broke both of his forefingers in a rugby match.

❁ After he got injured, he worried about meeting his piano teacher. He felt bad because he was such a serious piano teacher. When he went to the teacher's house to explain the 10 injury, the teacher saw Ozawa's hands and knew he would be unable to play the piano anymore. So he suggested, "There is a job called 'conductor*.'" Before that, Ozawa didn't know what exactly a conductor did. However, he wanted to continue studying music, so he joined a chorus* group led by a conductor. Soon he realized that music—its harmony, its 15 accents, and its rhythm—could be influenced by the conductor. Not long after that, Ozawa went to see a performance by a German pianist, Leonid Kreutzer. At this performance, Kreutzer conducted the orchestra while playing the piano. This impressed Ozawa so much that he decided to try to become a conductor. He then began diligently to study and practice conducting.

❁ At the age of 24, Ozawa went to Europe for further study in order to be a conductor. 20 Soon after he arrived in Europe, he entered* the International Competition of Orchestra Conductors* in France and won first prize. This was a great achievement and a great beginning for his career as a conductor.

❁ Seiji Ozawa's life shows that big problems can be overcome. If you miss one opportunity, then try something else and set new goals for yourself. If you change your 25 goal, work hard and try your best to reach the new goal. (346 words)
